In writing about Emmanuel's early years, 1895 -1902, Mrs. Florence Paulson noted, "We cannot help but sense the struggles that the congregation was going through. But still, Emmanuel was advancing, slowly and steadily, making its influence felt in the growing community."

And so, as we continue to move forward doing God's work, we honor our ancestors by not giving up, no matter how difficult the issues may seem. Remember, with God, all things are possible.


